Charleston reflects the history of our country. Discovered in 1521, the area was caught up in the Revolution, Civil War and many historic firsts. Carol highlighted four attractions in the area.

Downtown is 23 blocks of historically restored and preserved buildings. The best way to see the city is by carriage and touring the elegant homes.

Boone Hall is the most famous site. Best known for its long canopied driveway of 200 year old live oak trees, it has been the site of many films and TV dramas. The house has been rebuilt, but 9 original slave cabins and numerous outbuildings remain.

Middleton Place is a restored plantation home ransacked and burned by Sherman's Army in 1865. It is known for its breathtaking gardens.

Patriots Point is home to several Navy vessels including the aircraft carrier the USS Yorktown. All the ships are open to explore and various museums are dedicated to our sailors.

If you've never visited Charleston, Carol strongly recommended considering a trip to experience the Old South.
